The Bruno Kessler Foundation has always based its research activities on ethical principles that include study, knowledge, dialogue, and social responsibility.

Today the Foundation intends to make a more emphatic commitment against all types of discrimination by recognizing people in their uniqueness, regardless of gender, racial or ethnic origin, religious affiliation, ability, sexual orientation, and any other personal characteristic.

All those who work in any capacity at the Foundation are asked to respect the Manifesto Against Discrimination and to disseminate it to those who are not familiar with it and to report any incidents that violate its principles.

Helping create an inclusive environment characterized by behavior patterns and languages inspired by mutual respect and tolerance;

Approaching people with respect and empathy while taking into account interpersonal distance and proxemic space;

Encourage dialogue with colleagues to promote mutual understanding and appreciate the diversity of experiences and backgrounds that populate the Foundation;

Counter and report to the Equal opportunity and Harassment advisor or to the Whistleblowing channel any situations of discrimination that may occur within FBK spaces.
